

Andrew's primary and Wolfreton School and Sixth
Form College locally, both rated Good by Ofsted.
Haltemprice Leisure Centre has facilities for all ages
and activities like junior squash and school holiday
clubs. There is a Pure Gym on Springfield Way, and
golfers will find the highly regarded Hull Golf Club's
picturesque course down the road. Kirk Ella's
hostelries include the Wheatsheaf, its 'Slow
Sundays' celebrate the flavours of farms, fields and
the seasons, and the Beech Tree with familyfriendly menu and sunny beer garden. Lounge
Southella serves up cocktails and a chef-designed
menu. Whether carvery, fish and chip supper, or
McDonalds it is all conveniently close by.





Hull's Princes Quay and St Stephen's Centre are shopping and dining destinations while the old Fruit Market area is transforming into an exciting contemporary quarter with bistros, tapas bars, and venues like the Humber Fish Co celebrating the city's heritage with fresh fish and seafood, driftwood walls and Fisherman's Cove courtyard. The year of UK City of Culture celebrated Hull's cultural energy of pœtry, acting and artistic talent. Hull New Theatre and Hull Truck Theatre offer year-round performances, while you can catch the latest release at the Odeon Luxe or Reel Cinemas.

Kirk Ella skirts the foothills of the Yorkshire Wolds - follow the Yorkshire Wolds Way along the banks of the Humber estuary glimpsing the rich birdlife of the foreshore. Humber Bridge Country Park has spaces for games and picnics and wildflower meadows home to a wealth of butterfly species. Explore the meadow, pond and cliff nature trails and the chalk cliffs in 'Little Switzerland'. Immerse yourself in the wonders of the oceans at The Deep, from Amazonian turtles to the Lagoon of Light's corals, tropical fish and reef. Wherever you need to be transport connections are excellent with the A164, A63, and M62 nearby and train, bus and coach services from Hull's Paragon Interchange.
